I was also the developer and facilitator of the K-SAT web site. I developed, October 2004, an additional magnet school for NEISD in media technologies, called iMAK (Interactive Media Applications at Krueger), for which I was the director. The focus of both schools was integrated, standards-based curriculum.

During this timeframe I also worked for NASA-Johnson Space Center, developing for them and with Texas A&M -Education Department both the Texas Aerospace Scholars Program and the National Science Teacher Workshop. These NASA workshops utilized an integrated, technology-based curriculum with an emphasis on math and science. We developed the workshops in an effort to help teachers generate hands-on, applied content-area lesson plans that addressed what at that time were the new TEKS/TAKS standards. The process was productive, collaborative, and enjoyable.
